

Howard loves old trucks, cars, and farm machinery, and has reproduced many wonderful images in colored pencil on sueded matboard.





At each monthly meeting, attending TAG members will individually judge and vote by written ballot for the Artist of the Month. A TAG member appointed by the President will tally the vote and announce the winner. Art submitted must be the artist's original work (based on artist's own photos or ideas). Reproductions of another artist's work, or work copied from a magazine, book, calendar, copyrighted photo, etc. **DO NOT QUALIFY!** Competition runs from January through November with Artist of the Year being chosen in December. Once an artist has won 1st place, that artist cannot compete again for the rest of the year. Only TAG members can enter the competition and vote. Members will vote for their 1st and 2nd choice; and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place ribbons will be awarded. (In case of a tie, a ribbon will be awarded to each artist tied for either 1st or 2nd. In that situation, no 3rd place ribbon will be awarded.) At the December meeting, all 1st place winners may submit their winning artwork for Artist of the Year. If the work is no longer available, we will accept a photo of the work for the competition.

This was done initially from life at a Portrait Studios put on by Portrait Artists of Arizona. I did some finishing in the studio with a total time spent around 3 hours. Working from life was always frightening to me, especially in a group setting, and I avoided it for the better part of my life. Everyone has told me, to be a good portrait artist you must practice from life!, and "Practice makes perfect". I'm not perfect, but I have definitely seen tremendous growth in my work, more confidence painting in color; and I now truly enjoy painting and drawing from life--something I never thought would happen. I highly encourage anyone who is currently working strictly from photos (like I used to do), to get into an open studio somewhere and work from life.

Darrell was born in Ogden, Utah. He was president of the Boys Association and president of the ski club in high school. He was on the National Ski Patrol at Snow Basin Ski Resort and was a life guard at the city pool.

Darrell has always enjoyed doing things with his hands. He worked part time for a local body shop and learned to weld. In the 70's he started doing small metal sculptures as a hobby and sold them at craft shows. After graduating from college he went into sales and in 1968 he moved to Tempe with Menley James, a division of Smith Kline Laboratories. He and his wife, Sharon, were married in 1972.

After retiring, he and his wife decided to take a class with Donna Levine. They have been taking these classes since 2005. He has won several ribbons as artist of the month from TAG for his water colors and acrylics. His puppy, Halo, is a favorite subject. He has shown his work at the Desert Foothills Art Show and at The Farm at South Mountain. Last year he gave a program for TAG on framing our art. It is such an asset for us to have such a willing, helpful worker as a member of TAG.


