Ruth studied art at The University of Georgetown, the University of Kentucky, Centre College of Kentucky, and the University of Louisville.


After moving to Arizona, she took art classes at Arizona State University while pursuing a Master's Degree in Elementary Education.

TAG BOARD APPROVES 5th MFA SCHOLARSHIP

At its February meeting, the TAG Board approved offering a \$1,000 scholarship to a Master of Fine Arts student at the ASU Herberger Institute's School of Art. This will be the fifth such \$1,000 scholarship awarded. The previous winners were Sam Troxell (metal work, sculpture and jewelry) 2009; Jacob Fischer (painter/ cityscapes and interiors) 2010; Benjamin Phillips (figurative sculptor) 2011 and Rory MacLean (painter/portraits and figures) 2012.

The Outreach Committee will be reviewing the work of applicants soon and selecting a recipient for the Board's approval. The fifth award will be for the 2013-2014 school year. The 2012 award winner, Rory MacLean, visited with TAG members at the February general meeting and talked about his work this year at the School of Art.


JoAnn Mathews' winning painting, "Wild Ones"

JoAnn's Statement:




February Artist of the Month
