Elaine says,


"I love painting realistic florals, especially cactus blossoms. In this painting, the radiant yellow blossom shines out among the spines of the prickly pear. It seems ironic that the harsh desert could produce such lush and delicate blooms. I feel the brilliant yellow of the blossom is complemented by the more subtle shades of the buds. When I paint a flower, I want to show its personality. This is why I entitled this painting "Desert Diva."

I prefer oil as a medium because you can easily mix colors to get such a range of hues. It is also easy to blend and shade each petal when you are using oil."





Ever design a book cover? Gail Boyd just finished designing this cover for her brother-in-law's new book, THE RELUCTANT VOLUNTEER. It is the story of a man in his sixties whose life is transformed by being a Big Brother to a child suffering from a premature aging disease. Gail painted this 9.5" \times 13" image (including the lettering) on a canvas and had the canvas scanned to transmit the image to the publisher. The actual cover will be 5" \times 8".
