# TAG's Featured Artist Evelyn Gholson



In 2007, Evelyn retired from the electronics industry, where she was responsible for Worldwide Planning Operations for Microchip Technology Inc. She has since attended Brio Fine Arts in Scottsdale, AZ and received instructional training in the mosaic arts at Sedona Arts Center in Sedona, AZ.

She was awarded SunDust Gallery "Artist of Distinction" in May 2010 and received First Place in Sedona Winefest juried art exhibit in September 2013.

Evelyn's art resides in homes and businesses in Phoenix, Chicago, Dallas, Portland, New York City and many other locations. Her work is currently or has been represented at:

Evelyn says about her art:

"It is so rewarding to give renewed life to a once useful object through mosaic art. Most of my found objects were originally crafted from the earth, served their functional purpose and were now deteriorating back into the earth. The medium of mosaics allows me to resurrect these objects and give them renewed life, like putting a puzzle together with the result being an aesthetically pleasing design.

I was raised on a ranch in Texas, love the outdoors and always collected found objects (from birds' nests to old bottles, rocks and dried flowers). This gave me a sense of connectedness and continuity with nature and memories, while expressing myself creatively. Today, these personal emotions are artistically communicated through the composition and design of my mosaics.

When viewing the work, each of us can use our own life experiences to connect with these found and treasured

objects to bring a special and personal meaning.

I hope you enjoy my mosaics as much as I have enjoyed the "thrill of the hunt" and creating each assemblage into a unique design."





# September Artist of the Month Wilma Dilley

## Wilma's statement about her painting:

"I have always enjoyed a visit to the Boyce Thompson Arboretum, which has such a variety of interesting subjects for the aspiring artist!

This painting shows the Sheepshearer's Shed, located on the grounds of the Arboretum. The very simple, rustic structure tucked into a grove of trees was intriguing, to say the least, and the photo I worked from showed a play of interesting shadows over the grounds.

The medium of choice for this painting was acrylic, and my intent was to catch as much of the raw, rough personality of the structure as I could and yet show a bit of the beauty that appeals to the viewer when they come upon the scene."

"This 22"x28" oil painting, called "Curves", was inspired by a photograph my good friend, Cheryl Cliff, took while walking through the Botanical Gardens Butterfly Exhibit several years ago. The juxtaposition and the gentle curves of the calla lilies just sang to me and I had to paint them.

With Cheryl's blessing, I took on the challenge of attempting to paint two overlapping white objects while simultaneously trying to maintain their sense of luminescence, the delicacy of the petals, and the dynamic flow and interplay between the two flowers. It was quite a learning process and I loved every minute of it!"


