Barbara Clark Featured Artist

Barbara Clark - A Genre Painter

A genre painter is one who paints the things of everyday life, usually realistically. This describes Barbara's style – taking ordinary things and making them extraordinarily interesting. Barbara describes her process as finding something that catches her eye and taking photos of it. Then when she looks at the photos she sees that there is a lot more stuff than she had initially seen. Her job as a painter is to leave out those things that aren't very interesting and include those things that initially caught her eye. Barbara photographs parking lots, backyards, alleys, weeds, and other everyday things most of us would not look at twice. She says she is learning how to leave out more and more.



Barbara has been drawing since she was old enough to hold a pencil. She says she cannot remember when she wasn't drawing. For a while she majored in art in college and during that time was oil painting. She says she couldn't make the paint do what she wanted and, frustrated, gave it up.

When Barbara retired she felt the urge to draw again. She took Donna Levine's drawing class at the Pyle Center and felt



she should have done it long before. After the drawing class she took watercolor and later, reluctantly, took an acrylic class. The acrylics felt like she had come home – that the paint would finally do what she had in mind. Her first two paintings were scenes she altered from Arizona Highways and she gave those away. Her third painting was from her own photo and she still has that. She sometimes wonders if she would enjoy oils today and has experimented with open acrylics. They don't dry as quickly and Barbara says they feel more buttery on the brush. She plans to use more of them.

Barbara has two daughters, one in Houston and the other in Denver and has been with her current partner, Kathryn, for 23 years.

We look forward to seeing more of her work.


